Ranch Horse Trail - *It requires a horse to walk, trot, and lope through a pattern of obstacles, which can include passing through a gate, crossing logs, sidepassing, backing through an obstacle, and dragging an object. Horses are judged on their correctness, efficiency, and a forward, willing attitude throughout the course*

Ranch Horse Riding- *A horse show class that tests a horse's ability to calmly and correctly navigate obstacles mimicking tasks found on a ranch. The horse should be well-trained and comfortable, navigating various gaits and maneuvers smoothly, and appear natural with a forward, ground-covering movement. Judged on quality of movement, manners, and transitions, a ranch horse should be responsive on light or loose reins while still showing a capable and relaxed attitude*

Ranch Horse Rail - *A performance class showcases a horse's versatility and suitability as a working ranch horse. The class emphasizes a horse's ability to be a pleasure to ride through various ranch tasks, focusing on natural, forward gaits with ground-covering movement and an extended stride at all gaits. Horses should be relaxed, well-trained, responsive, and ride on a relatively loose rein with light contact, not a draped rein*

Ranch Horse Conformation- *Ranch horse conformation classes evaluate a horse's structural correctness, balance and muscling for a functional working ranch horse. Horses are judged on how well they match the ranch horse ideal, which requires them to be structurally sound and balanced to withstand a full day's work. The class requires a walk and trot of the horse around the judge and a line-up for individual inspection*

Mountain Trail

- Youth: 17 years old and under as of January 1st of the current year. Youth competitors are not permitted to compete with a stallion.
- Green: The green Rider/Horse is less experienced and defined as a rider with not more than two (2) wins or to have won a championship in this category. Green riders may not compete in open division at the same competition. No cross entry permitted.
- Novice: The novice Riders/Horse have more experience competing in Mountain Trail (Arena to Trail) classes with not more than five (5) firsts or to have won a championship in this category.
- Amateur Non-Pro: 18 years and older as of January 1st of the current year, who participates in equestrian sport for pleasure only, and has not received any payment for training horses or coaching riders in the equine industry.
- Open: This category is open to all riders and horses with no restrictions. Obstacles may be of more complexity and or difficulty designed to test skills of advanced horse and rider combinations. No cross entry with the green Rider/Horse division.
- Hors Concours (H/C) entries are not eligible for awards

We are going by Oregon Mountain Trail Rules and Green horse and riders may be asked to go through water obstacles.—

COMPETITIVE MOUNTAIN TRAIL JUDGING STANDARDS

What is the definition of a perfect Mountain Trail Horse/Rider combo? We feel it is a willing, forward moving, loose reined partnership between horse & rider.

In-Hand:

1: Touching horse with your hand or a training aid is a major deduction.

2: Pulling on or being pulled by horse is a deduct. The horse should travel willingly & respectfully with the handler.

GENERAL RULES (MOUNTED &/OR IN HAND)

1: The rider switching from one handed to two handed or vice versa within the obstacle is a deduction. If a rider begins an obstacle riding one handed on the reins, any touching of the rein with the other hand will result in a major deduction for that obstacle. If a rider enters an obstacle riding with 2 hands on the reins & releases one hand it is also a deduction (unless the obstacle requires it, ie... opening a gate, performing a drag, etc..).

2: A horse being ridden in a shank bit should ideally be ridden one handed. If a rider rides 2 handed in a shank bit it will be a major deduction and the max score for any obstacle is 9 (no 10s shall be awarded for riding two handed in a shank bit).

3; If all four feet of the horse stop moving and it requires a noticeable cue for it to continue before, during, or after an obstacle it is a deduction (unless course or instructions dictate otherwise). A reasonable change of cadence during approach, or throughout an obstacle is not necessarily a deduction if doing so aids in maintaining the horse's balance.

4: Ticking an obstacle by horse or rider will not be a deduction unless it disrupts the natural stride of the horse (ie. a slight grazing of a hoof on a pole vs. a stumble that dislodges or repositions the obstacle).

5: A rider removing their hand from the gate constitutes losing control of the gate and is a major deduction. Sliding a hand down the gate is not a deduction, as contact & control is maintained throughout the maneuver. Bumping or hitting the gate panel or post during the open/close maneuver by horse or rider is a minor deduction.

6: Any step backwards from an obstacle counts as a refusal, hence a deduction. General etiquette is that after 3 refusals the rider should move on to the next obstacle.

7: Starting an obstacle over after partially completing it receives no more than half the maximum allowable score even if the additional attemptss successful.

8: If rider dismounts to lead horse over an obstacle, their score is a zero for that obstacle.

9: If the rider goes off pattern & skips an obstacle, or performs obstacles out of order, all obstacles involved receive a zero score.

10: Tails of reins not being moved away from working side of horse in obstacles such as a gate, drag, or picking up an item is a deduction (for safety reasons).

DEFINITIONS & DISQUALIFICATION

The following types of bits are not allowed:

Any bit with a shank longer than 7 inches

Square twisted mouthpiece bits

Smooth twisted wire mouthpiece smaller than 5/16"

*Gag bits

*Mechanical Hackamore

*Other prohibited equipment:

*Tie downs

*Running/German martingales

*Cavessons

*All other forms of training aids

The well-being of the horse is of utmost concern and horses displaying consistent lameness can be disqualified for the remainder of the event.

Any inhumane or abusive treatment of animals will not be tolerated, nor will poor sportsmanship towards other competitors and/or spectators. Violations will result in immediate disqualification of the offender.

No coaching from the sidelines will be allowed. Violations will result in immediate disqualification of the rider & any others involved.

Unsafe horses will not be tolerated. Repeated rearing, running away, getting loose, bolting, kicking out, etc. will result in disqualification for the remainder of the event.

EVERY HORSE OWNER/PARTICIPANT SHALL CAREFULLY READ THIS NOTICE BEFORE SIGNING. NO OWNER/PARTICIPANT WILL BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE IN EQUINE ACTIVITIES (CALLED THE ACTIVITY) OR HAVE THEIR HORSE BOARDED PRIOR TO READING AND SIGNING THIS FORM.

TO: Canoa Farms, Ron Stolp and Kelly Allen their directors, officers, employees, representatives, agents, officials, volunteers, business operators and site property owners, (all of them collectively called the HOST). I am aware and understand that there are Inherent DANGERS, HAZARDS AND RISKS, (collectively called RISKS) associated with Equine Activities. I Acknowledge that these Inherent "RISKS" of Equine Activities mean those DANGEROUS conditions which are an integral part of Equine Activities, including but not limited to:

1. The propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and/or damage to property in their vicinity;
2. The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals;
3. The equine's response to certain hazards such as surface and subsurface objects;
4. Collisions with other equines, animals, people and objects;
5. The potential of any participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or to act within his or her ability.

I understand that injuries resulting from such "RISKS" are a common and ordinary occurrence associated with Equine Activities. I freely accept and fully assume all the "RISKS" and the possibility of personal injury, death, property damage or loss from being a Participant. I acknowledge that it remains my sole responsibility to act in such a manner as to be

responsible for my own safety and to Participate within my own limits. In consideration of the "HOST" Boarding my "HORSE(S) or permitting my Participation in the "ACTIVITY", I together with my heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, (Collectively called my "Legal Representatives") agree:

1. To WAIVE ALL CLAIMS that I may have against the "Host" and
2. To RELEASE THE "HOST" FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY for any loss, damages, injury,, or expense that I or my "Legal Representatives" may suffer as a result of my horse(s) being Boarded or my Participation in the "ACTIVITY" due to any cause whatsoever INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF THE "HOST" and,
3. TO HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY THE "HOST" from any and all liability for any injury to the HORSE(S) or any property damage or personal injury to any third party resulting from my "HORSE(S) being boarded or my Participation in the "ACTIVITY" and,
4. To maintain in effect a minimum of \$1,000,000.00 third party liability insurance on the HORSE(S) while boarded. 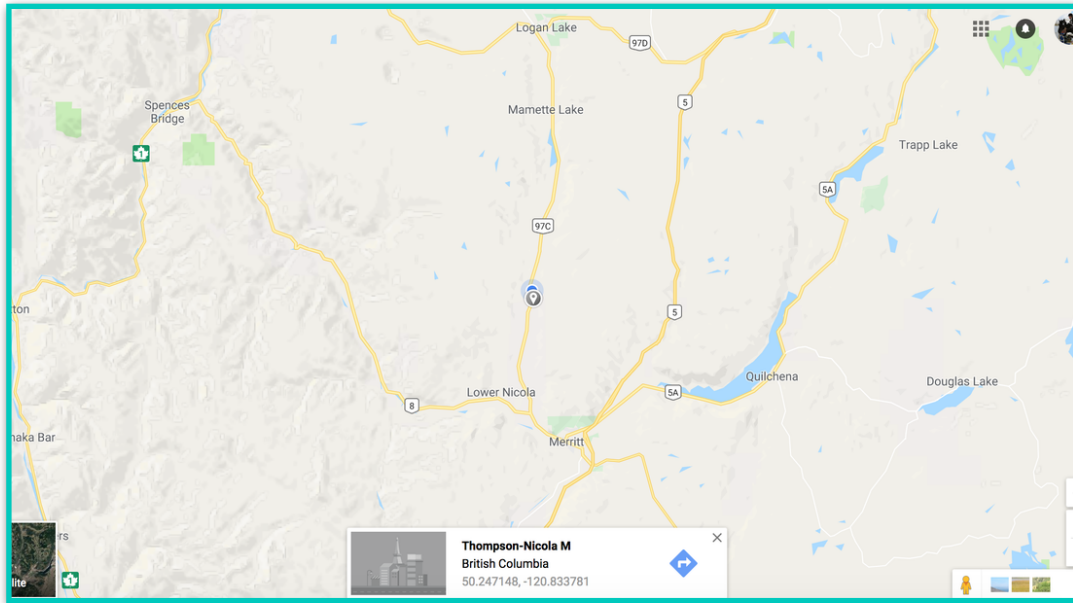

11460 Hwy 97C, Merritt BC - DO NOT GOOGLE ADDRESS -Coming from Merritt you go about 5 minutes out of town towards Spencer Bridge, turn up Hwy 97C on the right just out of town also known as Mamit Lake road go up 8 miles or 14k you will see Tuskast Icelandic Horse Farm with a steel blue rock ...GO PAST THIS!!

Then you will come to a big "S" turn that says 40k speed limit right at the eight-mile road sign "**keep going on the highway**" (**DO NOT TURN UP 8 MILE!!!!**) until you see the next driveway on the right. You will see a large Turquoise rock out front. Parking for all horse trailers is in the lower field.

If coming from Kamloops take the Logan Lake turn off go through Logan Lake and take Hwy 97C to the left. We are about 28k down from Logan Lake 9k from Mamit Lake. When you are getting close look for Steffens road on the left about a mile later we are the first driveway on the left just past the mailboxes on the right. if lost call 250-378-1670

Starting at 7:30 AM Ranch horse Classes will be up in the area. 6 pm Evening- Class - Inhand Ranch Horse Trail Stakes. Held on the Trail course.

Friday - Show starts at 7:30AM sharp so be up walking course early. Judges Walk will be 7:15AM - Lead Line will be just before Lunch.

Friday evening -Friday Night Pot Luck at 6PM

Saturday- Show Starts at 7:30AM sharp so walk the course early Judges walk will be at 7:15AM - Gamblers Choice will be right after the early dinner break Saturday evening.

TRAIL PATTERNS/ WALK THROUGH

Trail patterns will be available in the evening before each day of showing. You can walk the course but no horses will be allowed on course after the trail maps are given out. Before each new pattern the day of the show there, will be a walk through.

JUDGING/ SCORING MT

Each competitor is judged by three judges, each section of the course will have a different judge. You will be scored on how accurately and willingly you/your horse goes over or through the obstacles. Each obstacle will be scored on a scale, of 0-10. A score of "0" will be given for a refusal or of course with a perfect score being a "10". Example: 1-4 major faults, 5-7 average, & 10 outstanding, At the completion of each class, scores will be totalled and a final score, for each exhibitor will be given. Scores for the classes will be posted as soon as results are in and will get posted on our board by the ring.

Ranch Horse Trail - Judging will be like a normal Ranch horse scoring starting with a score of 70 with Plus or minus on each obstacle.

AWARDS

There will be awards to 3rd place in every class. Each day is a different show same classes. The last day there will be high point custom Molly Buckles awarded to all Champions and Reserve Champions will also get a special award from Spotted Horse Studios in every class.

DISQUALIFICATIONS

Anyone that is caught abusing animals/or any evidence of the act of abuse anywhere on the Canoa Farms property will be disqualified and asked to leave the property. This includes anyone abusing people as well. This is a fun group of people and we would like to stay that way. The main objective is to have a ton of fun!

LEAD LINE

Friday we will have a lead line class just before we continue after lunch. Prizes to all the Future Champions,

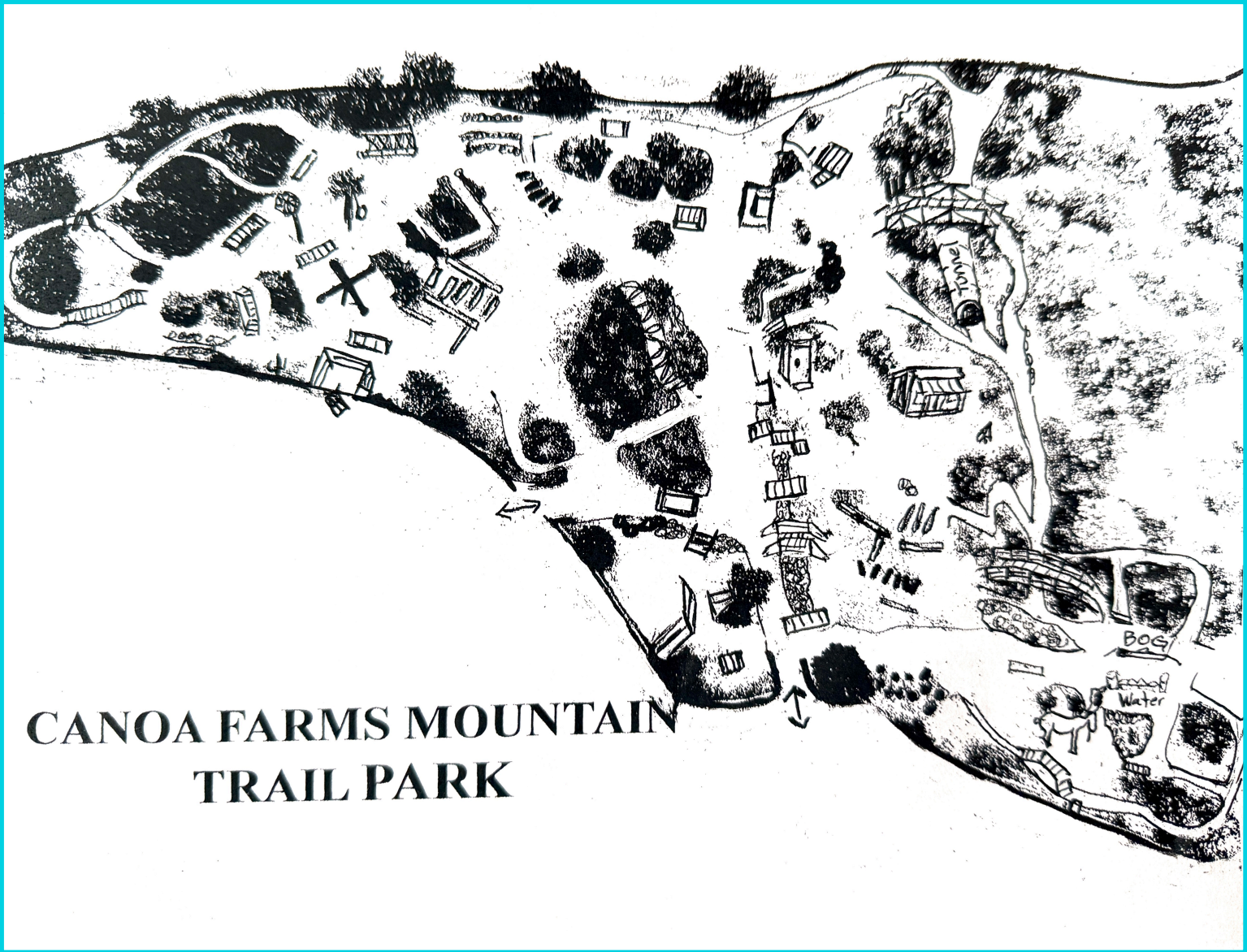
